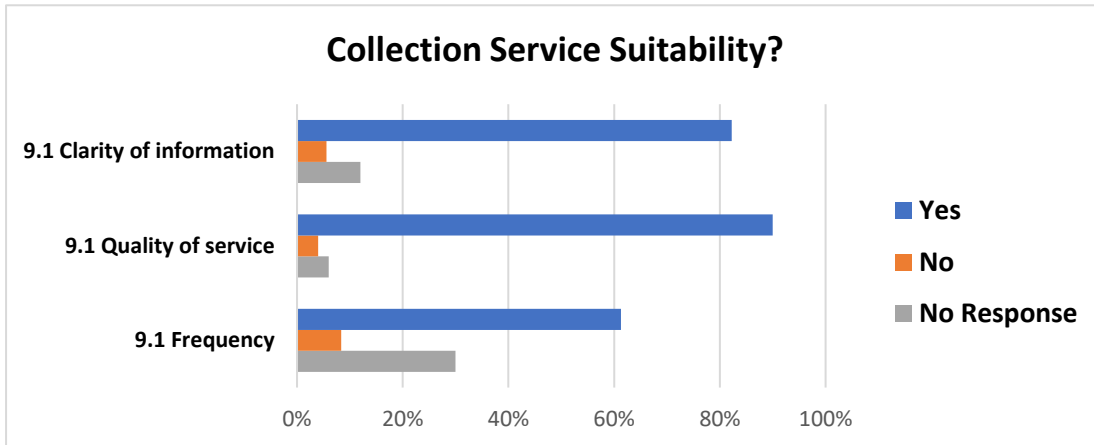


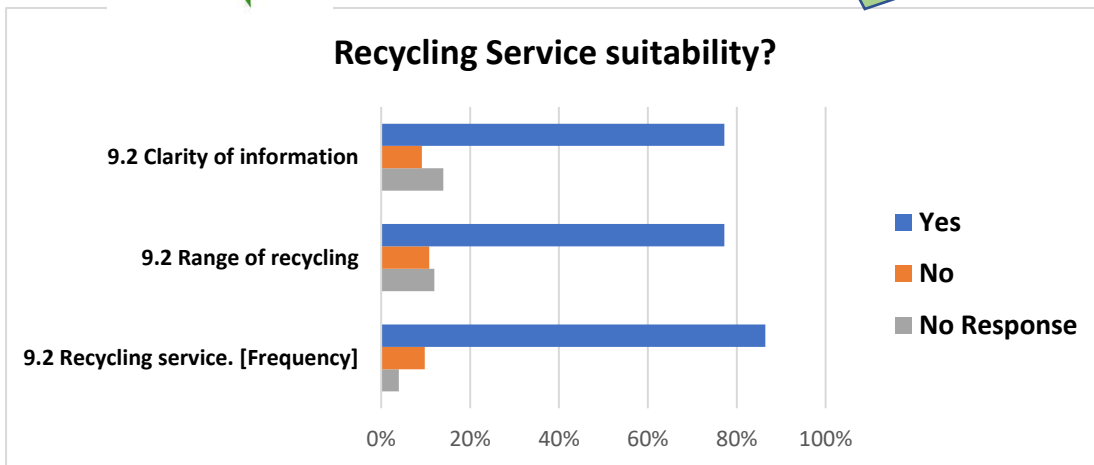
S9 Recycling and Waste Management

There is a high level of satisfaction with both the waste and recycling services.

The main additional waste request was for a weekly household waste collection in the hot summer months. There is also a wish to have more opportunities to increase recycling within the Parish and to include food waste. There are also requests for clearer information on what can be recycled, particularly plastics and also a wish to understand what happens with the recycled material. With increased recycling some felt that a larger recycling bin was needed.

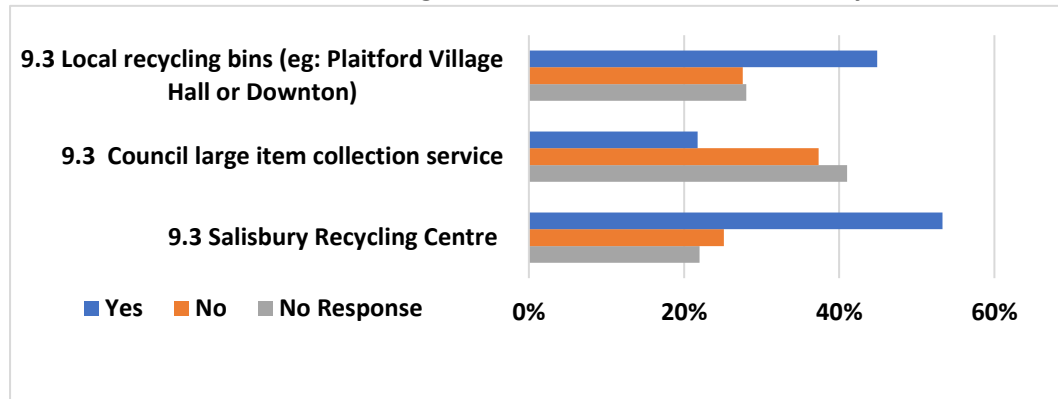


"Food waste collection please"

9.3 Household waste that cannot go in the normal collection bin? Do you use:



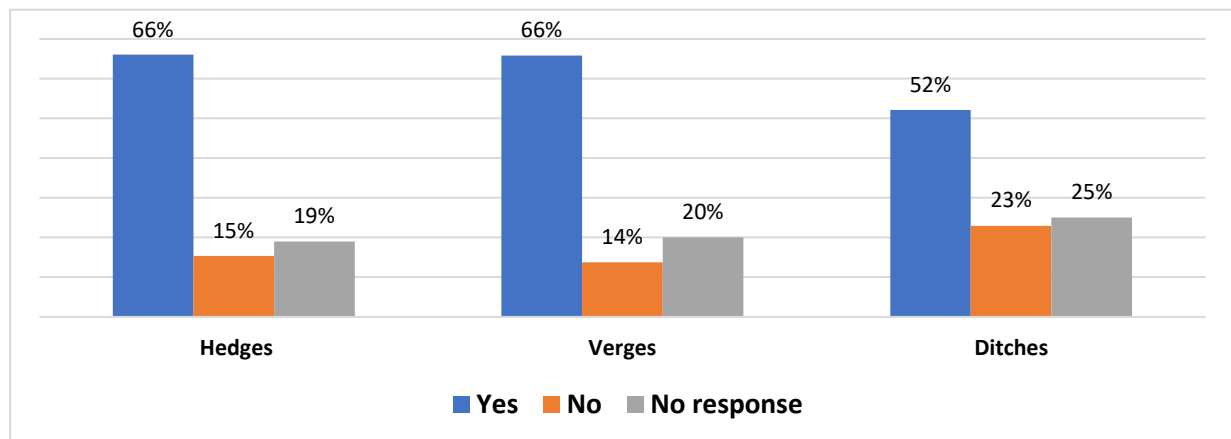
9.3 Summary

There is a very strong plea to be able to continue to use the Hampshire recycling sites, which are much closer and easier to get to resulting in less air pollution and less temptation to fly tip!

The Hampshire sites were not included in the questionnaire but the feedback shows that they have been used. Some residents would like to continue to use them in the future, if Wiltshire and Hampshire can agree a system similar to the Hampshire arrangement with Dorset.

S9.4 Are you satisfied with the general upkeep and maintenance of the Parish?



Summary

There is good support for the work carried out in the Parish. Non clearance of ditches and drains are the main concerns, resulting in localised flooding. This was considered more important now that we are experiencing more extreme weather conditions as a result of climate change.

Most of the additional comments (158) focused on particular locations. In general terms they came under the heading of poor maintenance with land owners, house owners and the Councils considered responsible for the ditches, hedges and verges.

Enforcement by the Council was considered to be one of the solutions, with information placed in Horizon, Facebook and Council notice boards to remind everyone of their responsibilities and the penalties for not carrying out the work involved.

The main verge concerns involved blocking of paths (often linked to hedges) and cutting back at junctions. Consideration for the timing of hedge and verge cutting was also raised along with the safety aspects of the work not being done.
